

## Scholarships

### University of Ottawa

#### **Constance Jones Scholarship in Women's Studies - \$1,000**

This is awarded to a women with high academic standing, who is pursuing a full-time undergraduate program in Women's Studies. Mrs. Jones, president of the Club from 1988-90 and past-treasurer of the Scholarship Fund, was responsible for all industrial price indices at Statistics Canada. She is very interested in the quality of education, especially its suitability for girls.

#### **Helen Nininger Scholarship in Fine Arts - \$1,500**

This is awarded to a women with high academic standing who is pursuing a full time undergraduate program in Fine Arts. Mrs. Nininger was president of the Club from 1987-88 as well as chair of the Scholarship Trust Fund. She was an active supporter of the Arts community in Ottawa.

#### **Gladys Harvey Award - \$1,000**

Awarded to a disabled women who is enrolled in a full time undergraduate program. Ms. Harvey, a graduate of the University of Manitoba, was an active member of CFUW-Ottawa. After her death in 1985, the Universities of Manitoba and Winnipeg named the Chair of Women's Studies in her honour. She was most interested in promoting education for women.

#### **Charlotte Whitton Award - \$1,000**

This recipient is chosen by the Financial Aide Department. The winner must be an undergraduate or graduate student who is either a Canadian citizen or landed immigrant, and must demonstrate good academic achievement and financial need. Dr. Whitton, CBE, president of the Club from 1929-31, was Mayor of Ottawa from 1951-56 and 1961-64. She was the first women to hold this municipal office in Canada.

#### **Mary Kyles Award - \$1,000**

The recipient is chosen by the Financial Aid Department. The winner must be an undergraduate or graduate student who is either a Canadian citizen or landed immigrant and must demonstrate good academic achievement and financial need. Ms. Kyles was Club president from 1980-81 and was active at the national level in areas of education and resolutions.

#### **Lucille Muldoon Award- \$1,000**

The recipient is chosen by the Financial Aid Department. The winner must be an undergraduate or graduate student who is either a Canadian citizen or landed immigrant and must demonstrate good academic achievement and financial need. Ms. Muldoon, a past Chair of the Scholarship Trust Fund and active Club member, volunteers much time to the Club and community endeavours.

**Muriel Axon Award - \$1,000**

This award is made by the Financial Aid Department. The winner must be an undergraduate or graduate student who is either a Canadian citizen or landed immigrant and must demonstrate good academic achievement and financial need. Mrs. Axon was Club president from 1976-77 and was very active locally in areas of education and resolutions.

**Lillian Gertsman Scholarship - \$1,000**

This scholarship, honouring the late Lillian Gertsman, is awarded annually in the amount of \$1,000, to a mature women studying psychology at the undergraduate level. Lillian Coplan Gertsman was an active member of CFUW-Ottawa and gave many years of leadership and service to the community, particularly to women's groups.

**The Reid Memorial Scholarship - \$1,500**

This scholarship is awarded annual to a full-time undergraduate student in medicine at the University of Ottawa. The student, either a Canadian citizen or landed immigrant, must demonstrate good academic achievement and financial need. The scholarship is the gift of Marjorie Melick, a member of the Ottawa Club, in memory of her father, John Vicars Reid.

**Barbara Newbegin Award in Music (\$2500)**

This scholarship is awarded to a graduate Music student majoring in performance studies in an orchestral instrument, organ or piano, who has demonstrated financial need and academic achievement. Effective 2014-2015 to 2018-2019 academic years inclusive.

**Barbara Newbegin Award in Mathematics (\$2500)**

This scholarship is awarded to a full-time undergraduate student in year 2 or higher of a co-op program in Mathematics or Statistics, who has demonstrated financial need and academic achievement. Effective 2014-2015 to 2018-2019 academic years inclusive.
