

Scholarships Carleton University

Harriet and Eugene Forsey Scholarship - \$1,000

Awarded to a graduate student enrolled in the Political Science program and who is working in the area of the Canadian Constitution. The late Senator Forsey was one of Canada's outstanding authorities on Constitutional Government. Mrs. Forsey was a member of CFUW-Ottawa.

Alice E. Wilson Scholarship in Geosciences - \$1,000

This award is in honour of Alice E. Wilson, FRCS, a paleontologist with the Geological Survey of Canada who was a charter member of CFUW-Ottawa when it was founded in 1910. It is awarded to a full time graduate student at Ottawa-Carleton Geosciences Centre. Preference will be given to students seeking to upgrade their qualifications after absences due to family responsibilities.

Helen Nininger Scholarship in Music (\$1,000)

This scholarship is awarded to a student with high academic standing who is pursuing a full-time undergraduate program in Music.

Shirley Greenberg Award - \$1,000

Awarded to a student who is a sole-support parent who requires financial assistance to help meet educational costs. Ms. Greenberg, a Club member and champion of women's issues, practised family law in Ottawa until her retirement in 1995. From 1990-93, she was Chairperson of the Advisory Board to the Minister of Defence on Women in the Canadian Armed Forces. Ms. Greenberg was a founding member of Legal Education Action Fund (LEAF) whose function is to put forward the position of women in Charter challenges where it affects women's issues.

Dr. Ruth Bell Scholarship - \$1,000

This award is granted to a part time student who has demonstrated a high potential for university studies and has completed at least five courses beyond entrance requirements at the university. Dr. Bell was president of the Club from 1968-70, IFUW Convener for Status of Women and Cultural Affairs 1980-86, and was appointed a member of the Order of Canada in 1981. Dr. Bell was also the recipient of the Persons Award in 2005.

Carol Shields Scholarship - \$1,000

This award is granted to a part time student who has demonstrated a high potential for university studies and has completed at least five courses beyond entrance requirements at the university. Ms. Shields, celebrated author and winner of the Governor General's Award and the Pulitzer was a Club member.

Naomi Rayner Scholarship - \$1,000

This award is granted to a part time student who has demonstrated a high potential for university studies and has completed at least five courses beyond entrance requirements at the university. Mrs. Rayner was an active member of the Club until her death in 1993. Her enormous courage, devotion to others, striving for excellence and perseverance in the face of adversity, were an inspiration to all who knew her.

Dorothy Powell Scholarship - \$1,000

A Scholarship in memory of Dorothy Powell is awarded annually in the amount of \$1,000 to a third year student in Economics. Dorothy Powell graduated from the University of Toronto in Economics in 1949 and pursued a distinguished career in banking, which included holding positions with the Bank of Canada, the Bank of Nova Scotia and the Bank of Australia. A member of CFUW-Ottawa, she was an active supporter of several local charities.

The Ruth Bell Centennial Scholarship, Honouring all Members of the Ottawa Club since 1910 - \$5,000

This Scholarship honours all members of the Ottawa Club since its inception in 1910. It is awarded annually to an honours student in Women's Studies (either as a single or double major) in third or fourth year, who demonstrated high academic achievements.

The Susan Scott Parker Scholarship (\$1,000)

This Scholarship is awarded annually to a registered undergraduate student with a disability who has demonstrated financial need and academic achievement. (Effective 2014-15 to 2018-19 academic years, inclusive)

The Earl B. Connell Foundation Scholarship (\$1000)

This Scholarship is awarded annually to a student enrolled in the Bachelor of Music program, at any year-level, pursuing classical music studies. (Effective 2015/16-2019/20 academic years, inclusive with the possibility of renewal)
